explore places of your choice.







- Watch elephants play in the water at Elephant Training Centre, where the baby and adult elephants are washed and trained.
- Visit the Pardesi Jewish Synagogue and see rare antiques. It was mostly visited by foreign Jews, who were deemed as "pardesi".
- Explore the St. Francis Church which is also the burial place of Vasco de Gama for 14 years.

- Overlooking the picturesque backwaters, Le Méridien Kochi is the perfect place to pamper yourself!









With plantations, waterfalls, organic farms, misty valleys and hills, and warm local traditions, Munnar offers everything that you desire on a vacation.






- Trek to the Pothamedu View Point for panoramic views of the Munnar valley.

views of the lush surroundings.








A drive by the most daring yet scenic route

### Things to Do:

- Climb the forested Keshkal Ghat which marks the border of Bastar 500 metres above the plain.
- Visit a colorful weekly haat markets on Fridays where they sell vegetables and tribal handcrafts like woodwork and soil art.









Bastar, in the middle of the tribal heartland of India, is known for its natural splendor, history and culture. The antiquity of the land can be traced back to the times of the Ramayana. With a goldmine of fascinating tribal culture, age-old traditions, waterfalls, ancestral temples, and dense forests, Bastar is a land full of surprises and many possibilities.



- Explore the Narayanpal temple, a breathtaking 1000 year old temple, built in the Chalukya style of architecture.
- Soak in the beauty of the Tirathgarh waterfall, as the cliffs downstream the river are believed to have been struck by a lunar crater leading to multiple cliff formations.
- Trace royal history at Bastar Palace, built by the rulers of Bastar when they shifted the kingdom's capital from Barsur to Jagdalpur.
- Embark on a Dholkal trek to an ancient 1000-year-old Ganesha statue atop a hill on the Bailadila Range.



Raipur airport to Bastar - 294 km. Hire a Savaari and enjoy a 6-hour roadtrip through the rural Chhattisgarh.



Bastar is home to some of the oldest indigenous tribes of India. The traditional tribal Bastar art is famous around the world. The tribal communities of Bastar have been protecting this rare art from generation to generation, and its sale is restricted to weekly have and markets.







Visit a local tribal market to buy Bastar's unique handicrafts of bamboo art, soil art and terracotta idols.





Bastar Cultural Indulgence

Witness the traditional cock fight at the Geedam Bazaar, where hundreds gather to place bets on their favorite cock.









The bustling capital of Chhattisgarh, Raipur is known for its steel plants but is also home to stunning lakes, ancient temples and terracotta industries. The history of Raipur is also something to admire, as it was once the capital of the mythological Haihaya Dynasty.
